ATHLETIC BOOSTER MEETING

CALL TO ORDER

Maggie Buechner called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. at Central Crossing High School.

MINUTES

A motion was made by Therese Chilton and seconded by Chas McCutcheon to approve the March 17, 2010 CCHS Athletic Boosters meeting minutes. **MOTION APPROVED.**

TREASURER'S REPORT

Team accounts were reviewed. Any activity after April 1, 2010 is not reflected in the handout today. Please remind all teams that they must reregister Kroger cards as of April 1. A motion was made by Therese Chilton and seconded by Coach Glen Blue to approve the Treasurer's report. **MOTION APPROVED.**

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Maggie took nominations of officers. She also reminded members that even after your kids graduate you are welcome to come back and help out.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR REPORT

The last round for interviewing for football coach will be tomorrow evening. An announcement of who is selected is expected sometime next week.

An offer has been made for the volleyball and girls soccer coach. The board has not made the announcement yet therefore it is not yet official.

Mr. Zoraba Ross informed the group that the tennis shed burned down. Insurance did not cover this. It is estimated that about \$1,500.00 of equipment was lost. It is under investigation with the fire Marshall. The request would be to have another shed built to store the equipment.

Mr. Ross announced that four athletes were selected to the Leadership Conference at the Fawcett Center on OSU campus next week.

Last month Mr. Ross passed out a brochure from a company out of Toledo, Ohio – "SFS" that does artwork graphics. The Music, Theatre, Orchestra and Band said they would come up with \$250.00 of the deposit, however, Mr. Ross informed us today that they have decided to decline on this. It was suggested that maybe each team sport could give \$20.00 to help come up with the \$250.00 so that we can get started. An email will go out to the coaches to see if they could help offset this cost. Then possibly each year the teams could commit to raising \$200 or \$300 dollars towards graphics.

COACHES REPORT

Track Coach Blue reported that the team has done well and they won the best in SW for the past 8 years now. Overall it has been a great season. There was some question as to times of activities that have been posted on the website and a few parents expressed disappointment with the conflict of times posted and events starting earlier than that posted resulting in them missing their kids activity.

Wrestling reported they had 1 district qualifier. We did well with the out of town schools it seemed. We won a lot of matches that we didn't think we would. We had a young team this year. We already have 14 - 8th grade students that are utilizing the weight room. We had 11 athletes transfer out but there is a possibility of 5 of them returning. The coach feels the team will bounce back this next season.

Tennis/Girls Basketball Coach Neil Hohman reported by way of an email that the Girl's Tennis team has been lifting and hitting each Tuesday and Thursday. They have 5 to 10 girls showing up regularly. Coach Hohman anticipates about 15 trying out for the team this summer/fall. They are working on setting up a fundraiser in May/June to help funds for the upcoming season. The girl's basketball has been lifting and shooting on Monday, Tuesday and Thursdays. There has been a good number showing up and many of the girls are playing AAU this spring season. Summer schedule is finalized with HS camp June 7, 8, 9 and elementary/middle school camp set for June 14-17. Flyers are being completed to pass out at the elementary and middle schools regarding the camp.

Girls Softball Coach Dorsey sent an email that reported that Varsity is 8 and 2 as of this Friday and have had some very good games. The two JV teams continue to work hard and are improving every day. Parent representative Tami Willis reported they have 2 fundraisers planned one is candy and the other is selling pastries. Opening ceremonies will be April 10. Scrimmage between Grove City and Central is on March 22 at 5:15.

Cheerleading representatives Therese Chilton and Loni Rice reported that try outs are being held tonight and will be posted by the end of the evening.

COMMITTEES

Concession stands are going well but we can always use more volunteers. May 12 we will need more help as this will be a big event with the middle schools.

The Applebee's Dine to Donate is still going on and the next date is May 7.

Tell the World Banners are available and we are getting word out to the parents. These are great for seniors. For every banner we receive \$10.00 back. Brochures are being done for advertising.

Scholarship applications have been received and May 7, 2010 is a meeting to begin looking at these. There will be one male and one female selected on May 20, 2010.

An application for “Pay for Play” was handed out by Maggie to review by the coaches and the membership. Maggie expressed this will set up some guidelines. All agreed that the outline looked good. Right now we are just viewing this as a guideline and maybe later down the road we can actually have an enforced policy.
