ATHLETIC BOOSTER MEETING
March April 15th, 2009

CALL TO ORDER

Teresa Black called the meeting to order at 7:04 pm, welcomed all new members and thanked all for coming.

MINUTES

Motion was presented by Colleen Channel and seconded by Debbie Schramm to approve the March 18th 2009 CCHS Athletic Boosters meeting minutes. **MOTION APPROVED.**

TREASURER'S REPORT

The March 2009 financials were discussed. The types of checking accounts that the Boosters hold were discussed. There are two main checking accounts. The first is the Main account. It is kept for the fundraising such as concessions which is the primary revenue for that account and contributions from private companies such as the Elks. The second account is the Team Accounts. That is where the fundraising money the teams account. Our primary revenue source is concessions. We also have 50/50 money as well as the Elks donation. The budget amount of \$10,000.00 that we have to allocate for team requests and emergency team needs was also discussed. A motion was presented by Gary Carmichael and seconded by Charles McCutcheon to approve the Treasurer's Report. **MOTION APPROVED.**

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Teresa discussed that she did talk to the CPA and an attorney about what will happen to our accounts if the levy does not pass. We are a 501-3 C organization separate from the school, so we will continue as an organization. We will still have officers. The accounts can still have deposits made into them, but there will not be any allocations made to teams. There will still be admin fees that will come from the main account, such as CPA fees etc.

Also discussed were next year's officers. Teresa asked if anyone interested in being nominated to let her know. As of right now, the nominations for officers are as follows: President – Maggie Buechner, Vice President- Denise Carmichael, Treasurer-Shari Bostard and Secretary- No one has stepped forward yet. The vote for new officers will take place at the May Athletic Boosters meeting.

Teresa made a motion that the CCHS Athletic Boosters endorse Issue 15. The motion was seconded by John Channel. **MOTION APPROVED.**

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Mr. Ross discussed Issue 15. He has had positive feedback from parents about the information being dispersed. There is a literature drop Saturday April 18th. They need about 300-400 volunteers to get the word out. There will also be a phone bank the week of April 22. Saturday April 25th will be Walk and Talk to spread word about Issue 15. Anyone able to help, please see Mr. Ross. Some schools in the district have placed signs

stating the items that will be cut if the levy does not pass. Mr. Ross did let parents know that the schools cannot put Vote for Issue 15 signs in front of the schools. It is illegal. There are still t-shirts with "I am the Levy" printed on them for sale. The Athletic Boosters will have those shirts for purchase as well as yard signs available to anyone who like them at the Best of The Southwest Track Meet here on Friday night.

Mr. Ross did discuss the OCC meeting that took place earlier in the day. He stated that the OCC is prepared to move on without our district for fall sports. If Issue 15 is defeated, we will be out of the conference. If we would place another Levy later in the year and it passes and sports are reinstated, there is a penalty to rejoin the OCC. We have to reapply to the conference and if we are admitted back in, it is a \$5,000.00 penalty per school. If we pass the Issue, then things will go on as normal.

Mr. Ross reported that the Boy's Basketball coach resigned. They have posted the position internally. They will begin to advertise publicly soon. If Issue 15 does not pass, there will be no need to interview. There will be no open gyms right now for Basketball.

COACHES REPORT

Boys Soccer- Coach McCutcheon reported that open gyms are continuing. Coach stated that there are many players participating in Club Soccer this spring. He would like to have several camps for the boys to attend, but will wait to see what happens with the levy, as many of them require deposits which are non refundable.

Softball- Coach Fullen reported that the weather has been really rough to get games in. They are off to a good start. They have Upper Arlington this week which is a big league game.

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Mr. Watson reported that some of the other areas in the district are not getting correct info out about the levy. Some areas still think that there will be band and sports if the levy fails. This is not correct. Please get the correct info out and Support our kids.

COMMITTEE REPORT

Scholarship-Maggie Buechner reported that deadline for the Athletic Booster Scholarships was today. They will have a committee meet and choose who the winners are. They will be announced at the Senior Awards Assembly. If there is someone who would like to serve on the committee, who does not have a senior athlete, let Maggie know.

Concessions- Denise Carmichael and Maggie Buechner reported that concessions are going well. The Boys Basketball tourney went well. There is a Girls Basketball tourney this weekend. Because of the lack of volunteers to man the event, it will be run by Boy's Soccer on Saturday and Football on Sunday. Denise Carmichael will be there the whole weekend to assist the teams. The teams will receive a percentage of profit after expenses. Thanks to all who have helped during the spring season. One item of note, the ice machine in the outside concession stand has been broken for a while. Someone came out to see what it would take to fix it. It would be approximately \$3,200.00 to fix it. It has been decided, since we do not use it on a regular basis, that we will not fix it. We may remove it and make room for more prep space in the back to assist during outside season.
