ATHLETIC BOOSTER MEETING
September 16th, 2009

CALL TO ORDER

Maggie Buechner called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm, welcomed all new members and thanked all for coming.

MINUTES

Motion was presented by Charles McCutcheon and seconded by Gary Carmichael to approve the May 27th, 2009 CCHS Athletic Boosters meeting minutes. **MOTION APPROVED.**

TREASURER'S REPORT

The May Financials were discussed. This is a rough draft from May and it is not exact. There are several checks that are still to be written for our Scholarship that we present as well as Insurance and professional fees. There was money from the team account as well as the main account placed in a 90 day CD to gain some interest approximately 1.25% while waiting for Levy Passage. The amounts were \$40,000.00 from the team account and \$25,00.00 from the main account. The CD will be mature on November 5th and be available to draw out and place back into the accounts. The Financials were not approved because they were not 100% accurate. We will go over all accounts again in November Booster Meeting.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Maggie reported that Teresa Black, our previous CCHS Athletic Booster President, will volunteer her time and do our bookkeeping. We previously have paid someone to do this and she has graciously offered to do it at no charge. In the past, we have paid a concession coordinator to open and close all concession events. We have since September of 2008, not paid anyone and had the officers take turns opening and closing all events. We want to be a total volunteer organization. The money we make goes to the kids.

Fundraising through the Kroger care program was discussed. This is something that all teams can be doing in the interim to raise money. We need to get all the teams active in this fundraiser.

Membership is something that we also need to continue as we will still be giving scholarships to our current seniors.

A special Thanks goes to the Vineyard Christian Fellowship Church for letting us have our meeting here.

Issue 47- Our levy for SWCS is November 3rd. Maggie said that the Levy cannot run a campaign without money. We have not financially supported any of the levies but we need to now. Maggie recommended that we donate \$1,000.00 to the Levy Campaign. The Motion was made by Teresa Black and seconded by Gary Carmichael. **MOTION APPROVED.**

Bylaws were discussed in the event that the Boosters would dissolve . The current bylaws read that the money would go to the Athletic Department. Our funds need to be secured. We may need to form a committee to discuss options and protect assets. We as members have the ability and responsibility to help decide what happens to this organization. We have worked very hard to make money for the kids and we need protect it. Discussed was if Boosters dissolved that the money would be distributed as Scholarship for athletes. This will be discussed in November.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Mr. Ross discussed if the levy passes in November that the District will bring back sports immediately and that a pay to participate committee has been formed to determine that amount. Parents asked questions about the kids who have transferred to other schools, if they can come back and play at CCHS? Mr. Ross said that two items would have to happen- 1) Referendum- end of school year with all Principals and 2) Legislation. Bylaws change.. We said we would have to wait and see what happens . Mr Ross said as he has been told that children that have left and the levy passes in November can come back but are are ineligible to play for one year. There was already a bylaw in place for athletes to transfer to other schools as we had no sports available. All sports will be brought back. We are still in the OCC. We paid our dues in case our sports come back. Winter schedules would still be honored. Winter and Spring Sports would go on as scheduled.

We have several coaching positions to be filled. They are Boys and Girls Basketball, Wrestling and Cheerleading. Interviewing will start and positions offered pending the passage of the November 3rd levy. Winter coaches will be hired first and then we will move on to Spring and Fall coaches.

We have lost approximately 294 students but have had 100 new students enter our high school.

COACHES REPORT

Boys Soccer-Coach McCutcheon stated that the boys are trying to play in some of the other club soccer and training on their own to stay in shape.

One of the Volleyball parents reported that they have the girls playing Volleyball at the YMCA . There are 2 teams per school with JV and Varsity participating. They will be playing there on Saturday nights from 6-9 pm.

Kathy Lalonde of the PTA at CCHS discussed doing a Homecoming for our kids on Saturday October 17th. They are also planning some other activities for the kids such as movie night and YMCA fun night. She would like to have a Senior Night for the Fall Activities. She would like the Athletic Boosters to fund the event for the Seniors.

Discussion was made about details and cost. Maggie said that we would need a budget of cost before anything could be done. Maggie also discussed waiting until after the November levy to see if it passed. If it did then we could do something then. Kathy said

we need to do something now. We said that we would see what the seniors would like to do and then make a decision on a Senior Night.
